



## **HELEN'S MESSAGE**

It is encouraging to know that despite the difficulties and challenges during the COVID period, MCF has not only been able to continue with its current projects, but also has initiated new ones in supporting disadvantaged children. Our circle of Friends, partners and sponsors are growing as a result of what MCF believes in and is achieving through commitments and efforts shown by all.

During the second half of the year, MCF's achievements included providing over 300 full medical check-ups to children. In addition, a recently initiated Dental Care Program provided a dental care teaching session to 240 students. The children learned the proper way to brush their teeth, the importance of dental care in a fun way, and over 40 children were given fluoride treatments courtesy of Oasis Hospital. MCF's Glasses Galore Program provided over 600 eye examinations and over 100 new pairs of glasses.

On a lighter note, the Universal Beijing Resort, compliments of their Senior Vice President of Operations, invited 40 school children to enjoy the experiences and activities of the newly opened theme park in Beijing.

UNICEF, for the first time, extended an invitation for an internship in their organisation to two students. We are hopeful this will be the start of a more sustainable partnership.

MPROV continues to support MCF's goals by holding their improvised comedy evenings and promoting MCF to their audiences. This is a worthy gesture on their part and it is greatly appreciated. By way of a small 'plug', I would like to say that it is a very enjoyable evening for anyone who likes a bit of sharp wit and repartee.

Shortly before Christmas, the Finnish Embassy extended an invitation to over 40 school children to experience the land from where Father Christmas hails. The children were treated to games, goodies and a taste of the land famous for sleighs and reindeers. My gratitude to Madam Ambassador Mikkola for opening the Embassy's doors to the children.

Another Embassy that opened its doors to MCF over the Christmas period was the British Embassy, where the British Chamber held its Christmas Bazaar in support of MCF. As always, a great day was had by all. This was the result of excellent organisation, plentiful food and drink, lots of vendors displaying interesting and colourful items, and carol singing courtesy of both the migrant and international school children.

On the theme of international schools, the second half of the year saw great support from a number of these institutions. MCF's partnership with the British School of Beijing, Sanlitun (BSB) has proved a great success to date and the strength of the connection is developing in a both promising and beneficial manner.

Equally commendable, the contributions by the students and teachers of the following International Schools is likewise amazing. Beijing World Youth Academy (BWYA), Canadian International School of Beijing (CISB), Dulwich College Beijing, Harrow International School Beijing and Yew Chung International School (YCIS), all have shown both interest and commitment to what MCF aims to achieve. This is both notable and greatly appreciated by our organisation and I trust it will continue.

With regard to organisations, a special mention and thanks for all the support shown by the JinShang Group.

Looking at the above lists of all those that have contributed in some way to MCF's activities, it is both encouraging and greatly promising to see such well developed bodies showing such enormous interest and support to what MCF stands for.

## MCF HEALTH CHECK UP PROGRAMS

#### GENERAL CHECK UPS

Due to the COVID situation last October, In we could not meet the parents at the kind school to discuss their children's medical gift report after the checkups the children past received. As a result, we delivered 125 progstudents' Health Check Up reports to the persochool. However, the medical team from child the GlobalCare Hospital has organised hea an on line platform for parents to contact the doctor to discuss their children's The report.

In December 2021, 46 migrant children received the Health Check Up. MCF would like to thank our partners and all the sponsors along with the Drs. and staff at the GlobalCare Hospital for all their time and support. Special thanks to our helpers for giving their time to distribute Christmas gifts to the children.

In January 2022, MCF accompanied a doctor and William who presented the health check up reports to the parents of the children that had their check up in December 2021. This gave the parents the opportunity to clarify any points that they might have had with regard to their child's health report. MCF would like to express their thanks to the hospital staff for conducting the examinations and providing the follow up visit.

## DENTAL GARE PROGRAM

In November 2021, MCF visited a kindergarten providing 280 children with gift packages of a tooth brush and tooth paste as part of MCF's Dental Care program. MCF believes maintaining personal hygiene is so important for the children and helps them in having a healthy life.

The MCF team comprised of William from the GlobalCare Hospital, who managed the video presentation on how to maintain healthy teeth, and asked the children questions throughout the session. Jane and Tang, two other MCF Friends, helped to distribute the children's gifts and information leaflets.

It was an amazing sight to see so many children show their enthusiasm and excitement at what was being presented.



MCF believes that they will remember everything they were taught and will apply what they learnt faultlessly. The Raffles Clinic was instrumental in helping to make this experience so worthwhile by contributing 60 tooth brushes and tooth paste gift packs along with the leaflets. Of course, William, Jane and Tang made the day possible by providing their time and input. I would like to thank them once more for helping MCF 'make a difference'.









## FEMALE HEALTH PROGRAM

In the first November week 2021, a group of students from YCIS delivered female sanitary packages to grade six female students at one of our migrant schools. As part of a community project, the high school students wanted to raise awareness on a health topic and teach girls common knowledge on the menstruation cycle.

They raised funds and prepared 32 care packages to gift. Thank you girls of YCIS. A very worthwhile undertaking on your part and hope it achieves everything you aimed for.



## MCF AT SCHOOL

Jane and Helen visited one of the schools that MCF supports and paid for the term's fees of Lixiao Qin and her sister, and Zhangzi Qun and his brother. Lixiao Qin told me that she had undergone her regular checkup and all appeared ok.

These children have all grown into young teenagers and look as though they are developing well. My thanks to Jane for coming to help ensure everything was ok with the school and in particular these 4 young people.







In August, MCF visited the Beijing Huiling community unit and spent time with 15 of their young adult residents. The community unit cares for both children and young adults who have learning difficulties. On this occasion, we spent the visit piecing together cardboard puppet dogs from kits brought along for that purpose.

Depending on their capabilities, some could identify and name different parts of their models, whereas others required assistance in helping to construct the puppets. Upon completion of the activities, group photographs were taken, summer blankets were distributed to everyone.

I would like to thank Trefin, the Rotaract President, along with Li Nan and Lionel for giving their time and helping on the day.

#### **Secret Santa Projects**

In continuation of our Christmas Secret Santa program, in the end of December over 350 Christmas presents were delivered to the children. These presents were kindly donated by various international schools, individuals and other organisations in keeping with the seasonal spirit of giving. A huge thank you to all those who contributed and participated in making this possible.

For the first two weeks in December, the MCF team was busy preparing Christmas gifts and goody bags to be delivered to school children of the schools that MCF supports. After preparing 285 presents, they were delivered to the first of the schools that we support by members of the team. From the photographs below, it's obvious the gifts had the desired effect and gave a lot of happiness and excitement to the children.

I would like to thank all those involved in dealing with 'Santa's Grotto' and the hard work that involves! I would also like to thank our partners and donors who were so generous in their gift giving. This included BSB Sanlitun, Dulwich School, Shang, Cafe Zarah and Erin. It would be remiss of me if I didn't mention a particular story which made me feel all our efforts are so worthwhile and mean something. Neema, a young pupil from BSB Sanlitun, celebrated her birthday

recently by donating the whole of her birthday gift proceeds to MCF school children- quite amazing! I always look forward to the Christmas season and the pleasure that it creates amongst children when they receive gifts that our partners and sponsors provide.

Thank you to Beijing World Youth Academy's Student Council for their ongoing support towards MCF! The Student Council plans and executes fundraising events throughout the school year to contribute back to their school and community. They presented two cheques to MCF received by Helen (Founder and Director) and Diana (Manager of Connect Program), as well as 25 Christmas goodie bags to the MCF choir members at one of our migrant schools.








#### MCF AT UNIVERSAL

Last but not least, my thanks to our volunteers Jane, William, Christine, James and Martin for supporting and supervising the children on the day.








## LATEST PROJECTS

MCF's Virtual Buddy Program has finished. We had a total of twenty-five migrant students participate, led by students from six international high school partners. Migrant students were paired up with an international school student for one-on-one sessions every Saturday morning for eight weeks.

The session contents were very creative and engaging, ranging from cultural exchange to mentoring in English, math Chinese literature, French, and more!





In late February, MCF visited a school in ChangPing and delivered belated holiday gifts to over 280 children. The children were very pleased with their gifts. The gifts included backpacks, stationery, books, plush toys, legos, games, puzzles, action figures, dolls and more.

We were met there by representatives from the Australian Olympic Team who donated milk and food items to the school. A huge thank you to all the sponsors. We were also able to deliver gifts to two schools in Tongzhou.

#### **Nala's Story**

For those that follow the story of Nala's education; Jane, Nala and myself visited a few schools in the Beijing Changping district. We finally confirmed a place for Nala to study Media Design and Creativity at the Beijing Institute of Applied Technology (previously called University of Beijing Applied Technology). Founded in 1986, it is a full-time comprehensive private non-academic higher education institution approved by the Beijing Municipal Education Commission.

The course consists of three years full time study at the institute, including internship and experience in projects. She enrolled and her fees for the first year were paid during the visit. I would like to thank both Jane and the Head Administrator for the time and interest they gave to assist Nala throughout the process. While on the subject of Nala's education, I would like to thank Adam for privately sponsoring a new laptop to help Nala in her studies.





## MCF STORIES

#### Peng's Story

For those who are familiar with the story of Peng Changyu, the little boy who had an operation in 2017 to improve his hearing, this afternoon I went with him and his mother to the Beijing United Hospital for a checkup to assess his progress.

The situation is that, though the hearing in his left ear has improved somewhat, Peng Changyu's case is complicated by other physical problems. That said, the doctor believes therapy can improve his condition. As this will be a long term commitment, it requires more than just treatment for a limited period of time. In view of this, MCF is actively looking for a specialist school in the Beijing area that will provide the necessary facilities to support him.









## MCF STORIES

#### FanFan's Story

Helen first met Fan Fan in 2015 when she saw him being carried around by his mother and decided to find out why. His mother explained that her little boy was unable to walk, so she had to carry him around everywhere. Upon hearing this, Helen decided she must help them. After MCF organized his medical tests, Fan Fan was diagnosed with cerebral palsy and later epilepsy.

Ever since that first meeting, MCF has been supporting Fan Fan so that he gets the healthcare he needs, including speech and physical therapy. Fan Fan is now able to stand on his own, is learning to walk, taking horse-riding lessons, and can say simple words like 'baba' and 'mama'.

#### Li Xiaoxing's Story

MCF started supporting Xiaoqing in 2017. At only twelve years old, she has been battling liver cancer, an extremely rare condition found in children. Due to the severity and rarity of this condition, her parents struggled financially to cope with the treatments needed for her.

Although Xiaoqing is still under medical supervision and taking daily medication, she is well enough to attend school. MCF is sponsoring her school fees and those of her little sister so the family can get back on track after a gruelling twelve months.
